The Historic Dentzel Carousel

eridian's Dentzel Carousel is truly a national treasure. The carousel is the only two-row stationary Dentzel menagerie carousel in the world today. Its crown features several original museum-quality oil paintings, and all of its animals are original as well, meticulously hand-carved from bass and poplar wood. And the house is the only remaining original carousel building based on a Dentzel blueprint.



The carousel has a rich history. Gustav Dentzel, from one of the world's foremost families of carousel makers, built it in the 1890s in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Originally designed for the St. Louis World's Fair in 1904, the carousel was acquired by the City of Meridian soon after. In 1909 the Dentzel Carousel arrived in Meridian. It has occupied its home in Highland Park ever since. Originally purchased by Meridian for only \$2,000, today it's valued at more than \$1 million. And, as residents and tourists will say, the experience of riding on this historic gem is priceless.



Around Town Carousels Abound

0 ne attraction lies at the center of practically every amusement park and fairgrounds across the country – the carousel. Carousels live at the heart and soul of American culture, bringing out the kid in all of us. Meridian proudly honors that American icon with a one-of-a-kind outdoor public art exhibit: Around Town Carousels Abound. Paying homage to one of Meridian's most popular attractions, the historic Dentzel Carousel in Highland Park, this colorful exhibit has life-size carousel horse sculptures standing tall throughout Meridian and surrounding areas.

The exhibit features over 60 horses, each of which has its own sponsor, special theme and unique design painted by a commissioned artist. For over a decade now, the entire collection of horses has been welcoming visitors to Meridian and fostering a love of the arts in all members of our community, young and old.

A special horse called Faith Riding Hope stands outside Hope Village for Children, a special partner to this project since it began. Proceeds from the carousel exhibit benefit Hope Village, founded in 2000 by actress and Meridian native Sela Ward to provide hope, shelter and treatment programs for neglected and abused children.

The "Around Town" Tour

The Around Town Carousels Abound exhibit invites both locals and visitors to stop and admire individual horses whenever they happen upon one. For a special outing, tour the entire exhibit with the help of this guide. Refer to the last few pages for the full map and key.

The 13 horses located in the heart of historic downtown Meridian make for an ideal walking tour. Start at Dumont Plaza, where you'll find a stately traditional carousel horse named Lady, and end with a horse made to look like solid gold that sits on the lawn at City Hall. The Downtown Walking Tour map and key are located at the back of this guide.

When you're ready to go a little farther afield, you'll find all but four of the remaining horses grouped into geographical sections: North of Downtown, West of Downtown and Toward Interstate from Downtown.
